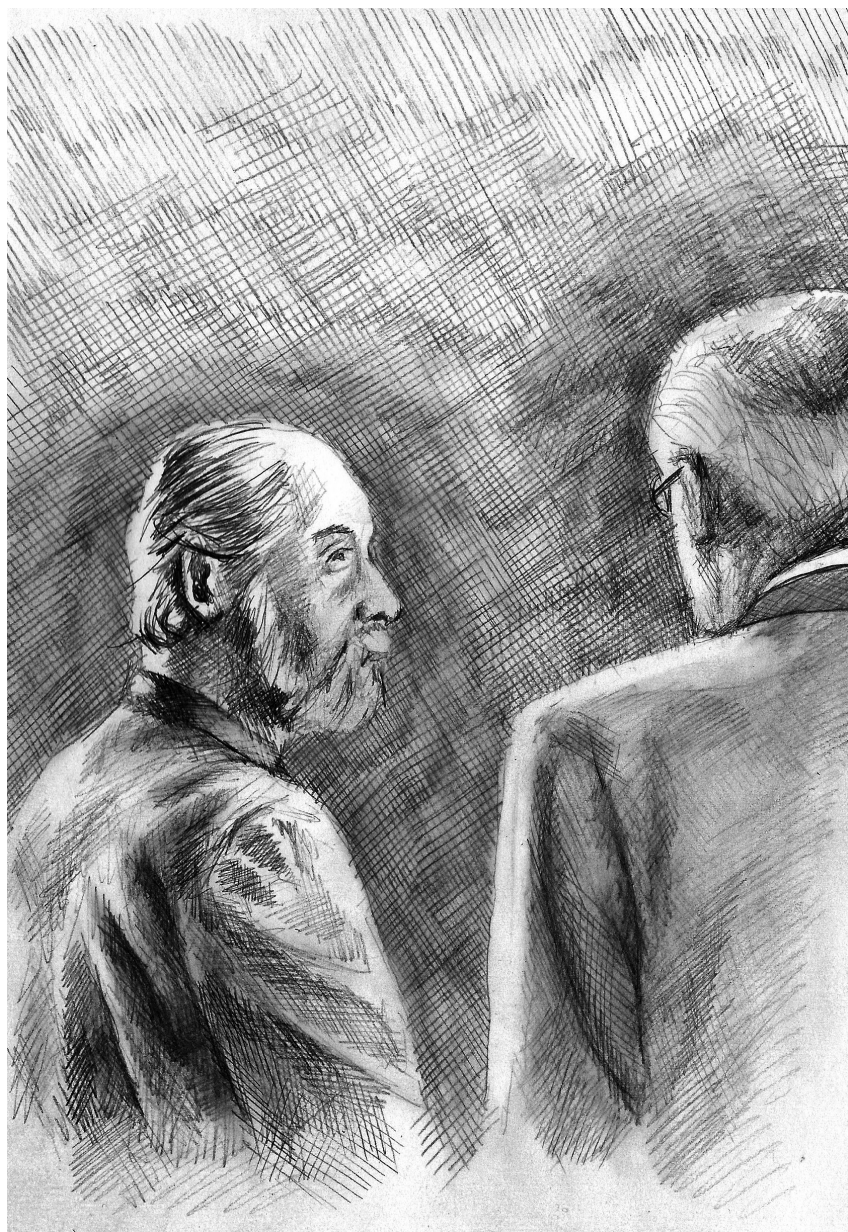
# LORD JIM

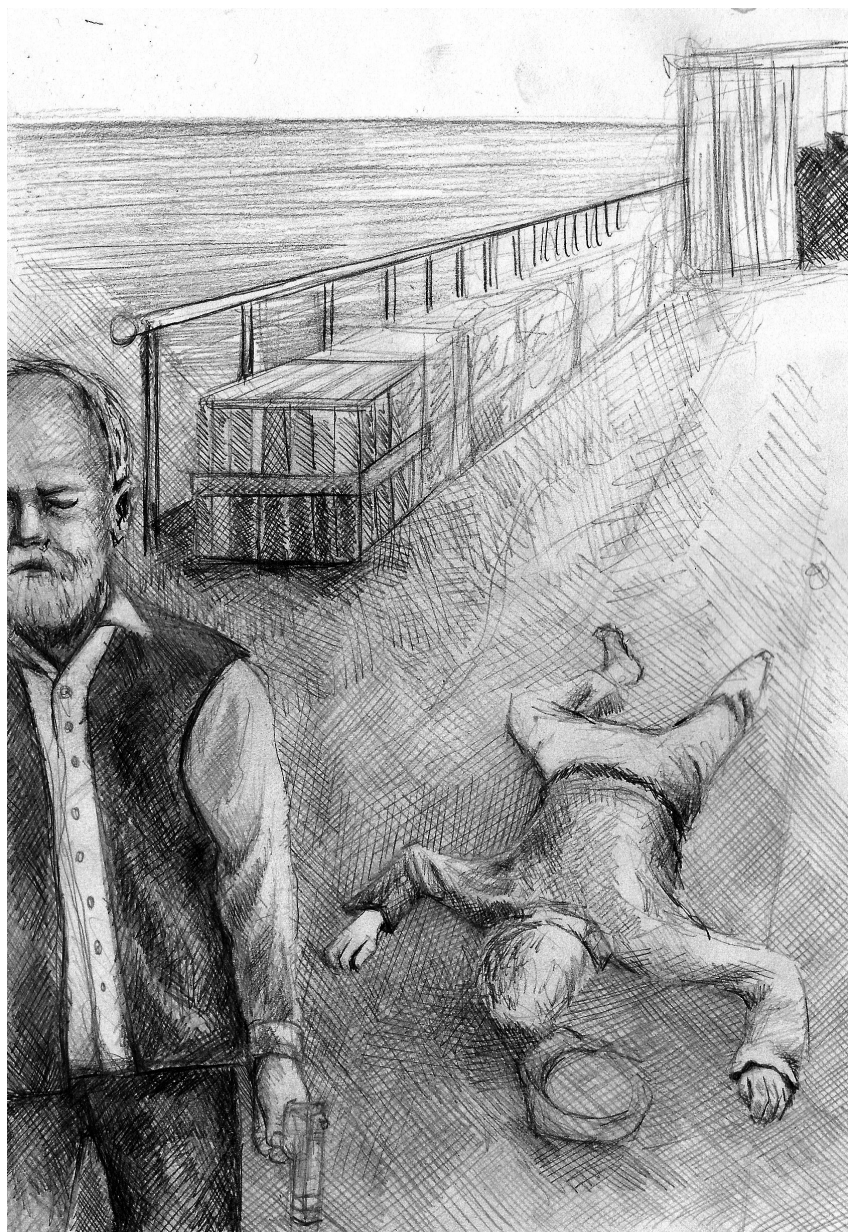


## Chapter 17
